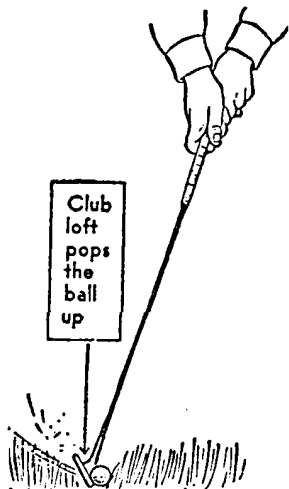

YOU'RE smart if you'll always play the easiest shot possible. The tough shots are for the stars—not for you. When you're deep in the rough, settle for getting out in a shot that will put you in good position for the next shot. You may have to take an 8 or 9 iron and cut down into the grass to get the ball up and out. If your lie is pretty good in the rough a 4 wood might be the club to use. The 4 wood will spread the grass, rather than cut it as the iron will. Be sure your grip isn't frozen stiff, as you need to hit with plenty of hand action in the rough.
