

RUTH SLAMS OUT 3 HOME RUNS, BUT PIRATES WIN, 11-7

Babe Also Hits Single for Braves.

Pittsburgh, Pa., May 25.—(AP)—Rising to glorious heights, Babe Ruth crashed out three home runs against the Pittsburgh Pirates today, but they were not enough, and the Pirates defeated the Boston Braves, 11 to 7, before a crowd of 10,000 here.

The stands rocked with cheers for Babe as he enjoyed a field day at the expense of Pitchers Red Lucas and Guy Bush, getting a single besides the three home runs in four times at bat and driving in six runs.

Some Homer, Babe.

Ruth left the game at the end of the Braves' half of the seventh after his third home run—a tremendous drive that carried over the right field grandstand bounded into the street and rolled into Schenley park. Baseball men said it was the longest drive ever made at Forbes field.

In his first appearance at the plate, Ruth pounded the ball into the stands, scoring Urbanski ahead of him. Lucas was the victim. Again in the third, while Guy Bush was pitching, the Babe found his eye and smashed one that landed on top of the stands. Mallon was on base at the time. In the fifth Ruth lined out a single to score Mallon again. His last home run drove Bush from the game and Waite Hoyt finished.

Pirates Keep Plugging.

Meanwhile the Pirates pecked away at the offerings of three Boston pitchers and managed to keep up with the Babe's pace in so far as scoring runs was concerned.

The Pirates clinched the game when Tommy Thevenow doubled with the bases full in the seventh.
