Hint:

The Polish Corridor, a strip of land, 32 to 112 km wide, that used Poland for the Baltic Sea after World War I. Hitler called for the Danzig Corridor polish because it wants to build highways in the corridor that would connect East Prussia to the Germans. Even more would give the Germans access to the Baltic Sea, however, Poland refused the demand.

Complete answer:

The Polish Corridor also known as the Danzig Corridor, to the Sea of Corridor was an area located in the area of Pomerelia (Pomorskie, East Pomerania, formerly part of West Prussia), which provided Poland with the use of the Second Republic (1920–1939) of the Baltic Sea, thus dividing the bulk of the province of Germany (Weimar Republic) from eastern Prussia. The Free City of Danzig was separate from both Poland and Germany. A similar area, sometimes referred to as the Corridor, was annexed to the Polish Crown as part of Royal Prussia during the period 1466–1772.

the Vistula river and most of the province of West Prussia and Posen (Poznan), the Treaty of Trianon (1919) has been transferred from Poland. Perhaps no provision of the treaty was not the reason for such hostility and displeasure between the Germans, because the corridor runs between Pomerania and Eastern Prussia and separated the part in the west from the main body of the German Reich.

On the other hand, it should be noted that the area was historically Polish (before the partition of Poland at the end of the 18th century) and was settled by the Polish majority. This provision was with fourteen digits of 13th US President Woodrow Wilson, to give Poland "an independent and safe access to the sea" and in fact for its only access and did not include Danzig in the CZ area, then a purely German city, which was established in the form of a free city under the Sovereignty of the Nation. Poland developed Gdansk's corridor port as the option of Danzig. The free German infection was allowed across the corridor.

Note:

The Polish corridor was the issue, or at least a clear excuse, on which the Second World War began. In March 1939, Germany's Nazi Dictator, Adolf demanded the creation of supernatural German highways in the corridor connecting Hitler, Danzig's possession and eastern Prussia. Poland rejected these demands and received the French and British guarantee against the German invasion. In September, Germany attacked Poland, thus the war started. Hitler removed the districts with Polish Corridor, Danzig, Posen, and Silesian border and won the remaining Polish region under the German governor. But after World War II was removed, with the great shifts of German and Polish population, the issue disappeared as the Polish Corridor, with Gdansk and Eastern Prussia later became part of Poland.
